The <u>Deputy General Manager Operations</u>, <u>Finance & Risk</u> advised that Council has contacted the company that did the assessment 5 years ago and will get them on site as soon as possible, but the issue is the weather currently.

3. <u>ITEM 12.7 – ASBESTOS MANAGEMENT PLAN – ROADS</u>

<u>CIr G M Turland</u> advised that he had some questions for CIr I M Scandrett in relation to the bag of asbestos that he brought into the chamber last week. [This matter is recorded in question and answer format not verbatim]:

- Q: Was there 6 pieces of asbestos?
- A: I did not bring a bag in it was given to me by a resident of McEvilly Road for the purposes of debate.
- Q: Do you have any idea where that asbestos was found on the 1.6 km road?
- A: It was found in the area that is currently breaking up and in fact that road could break up to the tune of 25 mm a year particularly with rain and dry events even more.
- Q: Are you aware that there was only .6 km that was identified by the EPA that had 14 pieces of asbestos found in that .6?

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- A: The resident advised that it came from the affected area.
- Q: Are you aware that the 14 pieces that were found had a 500 x 500 m² of 2-coat sealed tar put on them?
- A: This should await the report from the hygienist but the resident said these pieces were found in McEvilly Road.
- Q: The issue is that you are prepared to spend \$275,000 for Council to tar 1.6 km road and only .6 km of the road had asbestos with a 100 ml cap on it. I want to make it quite clear, asbestos could be found on any road in this district and anything from the scrapings of the road that Council takes has to go to landfill. There is probably a lot of asbestos picked up on the side of the road at any one time, but what I am trying to say is that the asbestos that was brought to the chamber last week that came from the resident came from the road and I am not questioning that but it did not have any tar seal on it so it has not come up through the road and has come from some other source accidently up and down the road. The \$275,000 should never have gone to Council.
- A: There is slag seal on a substantial part of the road which was graded and put in after the asbestos report 4 years ago and there is certainly a sealed area at the beginning of the road where it intersects Belmore Falls Road, but as to where the exact pieces were found I do not know but I do know there are 9 other roads in the Shire that are also similarly awaiting sealing.

The <u>Mayor Clr K J Halstead</u> noted that there is no seal other than the first section of the road as stated by Clr Scandrett and the rest of road has the placement of slag material on the top layer. He noted that there would be no further discussion on this matter.
