Why Staying Informed Matters

In a bush fire emergency, conditions can change rapidly. Being informed about fire ratings, weather conditions, and alerts can make all the difference in how you respond and ensure your safety.

Stay Informed and Be Prepared

Knowing the alert levels and understanding fire danger ratings are crucial for your safety. Always stay informed by monitoring local news, fire service updates, and using reliable apps and websites for real-time information.

Family Communication Plan

Ensure that everyone in your household knows how to stay informed and understands the importance of following updates. Regularly check in with each other, especially on high-risk days, to make sure everyone is aware of the current situation.

Community Involvement

Staying connected with your community can enhance your safety. Share updates with your neighbours and check in on those who may need assistance. A well-informed community is a safer community.


Hazards Near Me




BOM Weather


