Fire Danger Ratings

The new Fire Danger Ratings have four levels (formally six) Moderate, High, Extreme and Catastrophic and provide a clear indication of the fire if one was to start. The higher the fire danger rating, the more dangerous the conditions.

Fire Danger Rating	What you should do
CATASTROPHIC	For your survival leave bush fire risk areas
EXTREME	Take action now to protect your life and property
HIGH	Be ready to act
MODERATE	Plan and prepare

Status and Alert Levels

Status & Alert Levels	What you should do
EMERGENCY WARNING	An Emergency Warning is the highest level of Bush Fire Alert. You may be in danger and need to take action immediately. Any delay now puts your life at risk.
WATCH & ACT	There is a heightened level of threat. Conditions are changing and you need to start taking action now to protect you and your family.
ADVICE	A fire has started. There is no immediate danger. Stay up to date in case the situation changes.

During bushfires it is important to monitor conditions and keep up to date with the latest emergency information.

Neighbourhood Safer Places

Neighbourhood Safer Places are a place of last resort during a bushfire emergency. They are **NOT** an evacuation centre. They are to be used when all other options in your Bush Fire Survival Plan can't be put into action safely.

Be aware of the Neighbourhood Safer Places in your area, and know how to get there, as well as alternate routes in case the road is blocked or too dangerous to drive on.

Remember, your safest option will always be to leave early.


